This act of worship by the Magi, which corresponded to Simeon’s blessing that this child Jesus would be “a light for revelation to the Gentiles”.

The day is now observed as a time of focusing on the mission of the church in reaching others by “showing” Jesus as the Savior of all people.

You are invited to join us for this enlightening two week study on Epiphany. January 8 will focus on the Magi and a Bible study entitled, *Let There Be Light*. January 8 will be led by Ron Hoffman.

## **Councils, Creeds, and Controversy**

Do you understand the Nicene creeds which we recite in the Divine Liturgy? Have you ever puzzled over the meaning of “[I believe] in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made?” Only-Begotten? Very God of very God? Begotten, Not Made? Of one Substance? This course will step you through the first three ecumenical councils and explore what controversies gave rise to the creeds. We’ll explore the various heresies that emerged in the early church and meet some of the key players in the development of the Church’s confession. Along the way we’ll examine the relationship of the Father, Son, and Spirit as the Trinitarian God. We’ll also struggle to decipher what is meant by the phrase “true God and true man.” We’ll also grapple with the central tenet which is the starting point for every Church Father: the incarnation of Jesus Christ.

Our special presenter for this class will be **Dr. Mike Thomas**. Mike and his family are members at Bethlehem. Mike is Associate Professor of Classical Languages and Humanities at Concordia University in NE Portland.



**Children in grades Preschool through 5<sup>th</sup>** can be dropped off each week for Sunday School in our Early Childhood Center. Children will have a high-energy time of worship and lessons following the *Kingdom Quest* curriculum.

**Middle School and Senior High students** begin with an opening in the Youth Room (Starlight classroom) before heading off to their respective classes.

# World Mission News

## Focus Ministry

The Christmas season is always a special time of the year for most people. This is true for the international students, especially for those students who are non-Christian. It gives the students opportunities to study our culture by observing how we react to holiday traditions that we often take for granted. The students ask questions that we have to stop and think about.

For example, on one of the evenings when I met with some Chinese students to look at Christmas displays in the neighborhoods and in some of the local stores. One of the students was curious about Christmas trees. He asked me a couple of questions that I had never given much thought about. He was curious if there was a meaning to the different sizes of lights on the trees—why do some trees have big light bulbs and others small bulbs. This wasn't too hard to answer because of the changes in technology—smaller bulbs use less energy than bigger ones; however, some people have their favorite types of lights and still want to use them each year.

The second question was more difficult to answer—what is the meaning of the round, glass ornaments on the trees. I hadn't give these any thought, because they have always been there as decorations ever since I remember. I really couldn't give him a good answer that evening; it would require some research into origins or our Christmas traditions. I told him I would get back to him.

As the evening went along, other questions came up that provided opportunities to share the Gospel. I pray that he wasn't confused by all of the answers that I provided him. I also pray that he had the opportunity to think about the things that we talked about. Overall, I continue to thank God for the different opportunities to share His Word. These opportunities keep me on my toes in understanding our traditions and use them to share the Gospel.

## Christmas Traditions in the Philippines

One of the Philippine missionaries that I met last summer returned to the Philippines to work with the local Lutheran churches. In a recent newsletter, he share a few traditions that I thought I'd pass along:

- Filipinos love to shoot off fireworks both on Christmas Eve and on New Year's Eve—these are typically done by individual families. The result is loud activities going on during those particular evenings.
- **Simbang Gabi** (a Roman Catholic tradition), is a worship service conducted in the middle of the night( 4 AM) 16 days before Christmas. After the service, a rice cake, called **Puto Bungbong** is served.
- Filipinos love just as much, as Americans, to go house-to-house Christmas caroling, visiting both the homes of friends and family, and those who live in neighborhoods. I particularly remember people coming by and saying **Pasco**, or **Maligayang Pasco** (merry Christmas). Some of these carolers expected a small donation for the poor. Because it is Christmas, people don't mind the extra monetary donations for the poor.
- **Mano Po Ninong**. This is gift giving similar to the US tradition. However, on Christmas, Godparents give a special gift to their baptized godchild.

## Good News from Russia



Rev. Alan Ludwig serving Russia shares the following news: "Every Reformation Day, I marvel as I hear how clearly and purely the Gospel is proclaimed here. How can this be when less than a generation ago no one preached the Word of grace at all? And yet, the Lutheran church is no stranger here. The Reformation came to Russia already during the 16th century, and continues today, despite decades in the 20th century when its public voice was silent. Like a vigorous plant, the Lutheran confession has sprouted, grown, budded and blossomed after being cut down. The difference now is that in the old days, Lutherans were ethnic Germans, Scandinavians and other foreigners transplanted to Russia, with liturgies and hymns in the languages of their motherlands. Now, the Siberian Evangelical Lutheran Church is ethnically Russian and is Russian-speaking. It is made up almost entirely of people who have no ethnic Lutheran heritage, but whom the Spirit has led to the conviction that the Gospel of God's grace in Jesus Christ is the truth that sets them free."

## Good News from Hong Kong

GEO\* missionary Matt Fick shares the following news from Hong Kong: "While in Hong Kong for a conference recently, a high school student asked a fellow missionary and me, 'Why do you believe in God?' I explained that I was blessed to have been raised in a Christian home. I heard Bible stories even before I can remember. But I know that I do bad things. Because of this, I know I need someone to save me, and Jesus did this for me. Because God loves us so much, Jesus died for all the bad things I do. I don't do good things all the time, but I know that God sees me through Jesus' goodness. I've also seen people change—they try to do good after they believe in God. That's what's so amazing about God—He changes people. At this point, I asked her and her friends about their beliefs. While none of them believe in God, they are at least hearing about God's Word in the Lutheran school they are attending. Pray that they may continue opening their hearts to God and that the Holy Spirit uses moments such as these to bring them to faith."

- For continued connections with International students, to help them find Jesus and the answers that they are looking for.
- For the recovery efforts for the people of the Southern Philippines who lost family members, homes, and jobs due to the recent flash floods in Mindanao. Although our own family wasn't affected by this tragedy, a lot of people were and will continue hurt due to this disaster.
- For safety of the missionaries throughout the world as they continue to proclaim Jesus. Also pray for many hearts to be opened to the message of hope through Jesus.

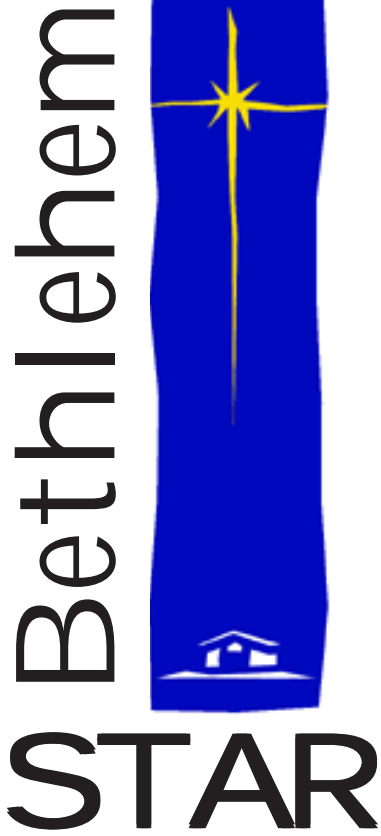
